Kentucky Derby Dinner Party

We're all too busy to go to Louisville, so let's just get all decked out and come out to West Chester for Kentucky Derby #143...Big Screen/HDTV-style.

This Churchill Downs extravaganza has been a celebrated event ever since its inception in 1875. It's all about tradition, it's all about style, it's all about partying, and it's also the greatest two minutes in sports!

Held annually on the first Saturday in May, it's the first jewel in the Triple Crown of Thoroughbred Horseracing. It's the biggest party in the South, but we're bringing it out West (to West Chester, that is!) Mint juleps are served on arrival. Plus we will provide sodas/wine/beer all through the party.

Cost is \$15 p/p for members, \$25 p/p for nonmembers. Everyone attending must also bring one dish per person (appetizer, side or dessert; again, we'll serve the main course.) Please let us know in advance what your dish will be (so we don't have duplications).

We'll be awarding prizes for "Best Hat," "Dressiest Derby Outfit," etc., so come dressed to impress!

Before the race starts, we'll have \$2/horse betting (betting is strictly random, we draw the horse's name from a hat); so bring some extra dollars for that! Often there are only fifteen or so horses competing; so arrive early to be sure you get to place a bet (one bet per horse.) Then we'll all mill around like millionaires in our own "Millionaire's Row," wearing our Derby hats, sipping our mint juleps, welcoming in Spring, and of course singing "My Old Kentucky Home."

This party is always a big hit and goes on well past the race; giving us plenty of time to award all our prizes, dole out the cash to the winners of the Race (Win/Place/Show), and then enjoy our buffet dinner and dessert. Space is limited and once we reach our quota, you will be placed on the Waiting List...so be smart and sign up early!

Directions: from King of Prussia

- 1. Take 202 south, once you pass Malvern, stay LEFT...follow signs for West Chester.
- 2. Take the very next exit (Boot Road exit)
- 3. At the light at the Boot Road exit, Turn Right on Boot Road.
- 4. Go Straight on Boot Road for about 1/2 mile
- 5. Go Left on Phoenixville Pike (at light.) (Rite Aid on Right Side Corner of Phoenixville Pike.)
- 6. Go Straight on Phoenixville Pike to the Third Right, Killington Circle.
- 7. Turn Right on Killington and immediate left on Winthrop. We're on the corner, **1210 Winthrop.**





Tour the Glencairn Museum

Glencairn Museum is a castle-like structure built in the Medieval (Romanesque) style between 1928 and 1939, and has been listed on the National Register of Historic Places since August, 1978. The museum is also part of a larger historic district which was designated as a National Historic Landmark in October, 2008.

The museum was constructed primarily as the home of Raymond and Mildred Pitcairn, but was also designed to house the Pitcairn's collection of medieval objects and art. The main floor has been preserved as it was during the Pitcairn's residence, while the other floors have been converted to exhibit the vast Pitcairn collection.

The collection has garnered wide renown, and is rich in history with room after room of exquisite treasures such as stained glass, carvings, paintings, sculpture, and statuary. The museum is closed on Mondays, but guided tours are otherwise available on a daily basis.

Our own May 13 guided tour will start at 3:00 PM and last approximately 2 hours. A fee of \$10 per person will apply.

The destination address of the museum is 1001 Cathedral Road, Bryn Athyn, Pa. In this day of the GPS and Map Quest we won't be providing directions. These can be obtained by entering the destination address in the device of your choice.

Following the tour we will be scheduling a 5:00 dinner at the White Elephant, a Thai restaurant located an easy 3.8 mile drive from the museum site. The "Elephant" serves excellent cuisine, reasonably priced in a comfortable setting, and is BYOB. Directions will be provided for those interested.

"FIELD TRIP" to Washington DC by Megabus Saturday, June 3rd 7:15 a.m. Beginning at Paoli Station

On this day trip, we will take the **Megabus** from 30th Street Station to Washington DC, eat lunch at the Native American Museum, then take a tour at that Museum. Afterwards, you will be free to visit other museums in walking distance. We return by Megabus to 30th Street Station, and then back out to Paoli for a long but very interesting and rewarding day!!

We will meet on Saturday, June 3rd at the Paoli Train Station, 13 N. Valley Rd., at 7:15 am. Parking at Paoli Station is free on Saturday. At the Paoli Train Station purchase 2 tickets to take the train to, and return from, 30th Street Station. For Seniors over age 65, the cost is \$1 each way. You can also buy the ticket on the train. The train leaves Paoli at 7:24 am and arrives at 30th Street Station at 8:05 am. In 30th Street Station, we will walk to board the Megabus. We must be at the Megabus stop at least 15 minutes before departure. The Megabus leaves 30th Street Station at 8:30 am and arrives at Union Station in Washington DC at 11:20 am (you can nap during the trip!). If you prefer to meet us at 30th Street Station instead of Paoli, please let us know. Just arrive 15 minutes before the 8:30 am departure time.

IMPORTANT: You must buy your own round trip tickets for the Megabus online. Go to

www.Megabus.com. Put in June 3 for the departure and return dates. Also enter Philadelphia and Washington DC as the origin and destination. Select 8:30 am as the departure time and 5:45 pm as the return time. The cost starts at \$24.00 for the round trip. If you have already purchased your return ticket for 6:20 pm, try to cancel that and purchase a return ticket for 5:45 pm.

PLEASE NOTE: The cost goes up, the longer that you wait to make reservations. We will be glad to help you reserve the tickets.

After arriving at Union Station, we will walk to the Native American Museum. It is about a 15 minute walk (you can also take a taxi!). The tour starts at 1:30 pm. and lasts about 45 minutes. The tour guides are Native Americans and are absolutely fabulous.

Before the tour, we will eat lunch at the cafeteria in the Native American Museum. The food is gourmet and thoroughly enjoyable.

After the tour, you have your choice of museums. We suggest the following: Air & Space Museum, *The Newseum*, and/or the World War II Memorial, all of which are in walking distance of the Native American Museum. The Air & Space Museum is almost next door to the Native American Museum. The Newseum (history of newspapers and other media – it's truly awesome!) is about two blocks from the Native American Museum. The World War II Memorial is outdoors and is also close to the Native American Museum. We will help anyone that needs directions.

We will meet again at Union Station at 5 pm to catch the Megabus for home. Buy food for dinner there to eat on the bus on the way to 30th Street Station. The Megabus leaves Union Station at 5:45 pm and arrives at 30th Street at 9:05 p.m. The Paoli Train leaves 30th Street Station at 10:09 pm, arriving at Paoli at 10:50 pm.

Wear good walking shoes since we will be walking from the train station to the various museums. Also, in case of rain, please bring a small umbrella. Please be aware that security is very tight at these museums so bring as few items as possible. All the museums have free admission except *The Newseum* which is not a government facility.

The River Trail on the OTHER side of the river in Valley Forge Park is a delightful walk/stroll any time of year and early June is no exception! What better way to enjoy beautiful scenery and glorious weather!! There are NO hills on this trail, just a wide gravel path and views of the river! You can elect to do TWO, FOUR, or SIX (the entire length and back) miles and these checkpoints are well-marked en route. In addition, after our hike, we'll we'll go for lunch at a nearby eatery.

We start at the Betzwood Bridge parking lot area. Take the Rt. 363 exit from Route 422 which is immediately after you cross the Schuylkill River. Stay in the left hand lane of the exit ramp and turn LEFT at the top of the ramp. You will cross over Rt. 422, make another left, and head towards the river. Turn RIGHT into the park after a short downhill and **go to the END of the road** past the bathrooms on your left and park as close to the start of the River Trail as possible.
