

Laurel Hill Cemetery Tour and BYOB Dinner at "Fig"

Philadelphia

On Sunday October 1 Philip Harvey will be hosting a tour of the marvelous Laurel Hill Cemetery to be followed by an excellent BYOB dinner at "Fig" restaurant.

Laurel Hill is the second oldest "rural cemetery" in the United States (Boston has the oldest). It has extensive acreage overlooking the Schuylkill River and Fairmount Park and is one of the most beautiful locations in the City of Philadelphia. It is a burial who's who of prominent Philadelphians in banking, politics, industry, military (31 Civil War general officers), athletics and the arts. It is also an instructive museum of different burial practices and monument types as they evolved over the years. It is located about three miles north of the Philadelphia Museum of Art on the East River (Kelly) Drive. For an overview Google www.thelaurelhillcemetery.org.

The "tour du jour" for October 1 is "Pints and Plots" which will feature the "resting places" of Philadelphia's legendary "maltsters" who earned Philadelphia the reputation in earlier times of a major beer and ale producing center. Commentary will also be made by the tour guide about the different memorials used to mark the individual graves. The tour starts at 1:00PM and runs to about 3:00PM. It will be followed by a beer tasting.


Philip suggests arriving around 12:30PM as it takes a while to make payment and get signed up for the tour. The cost (including the tasting) is \$18 for

seniors (65 plus) and \$20 for others. "Fig" is cash only and BYOB and will not give individual checks. Please bring enough cash and diverse bills (including lots of ones) to simplify settling the Laurel Hill charges and "Fig" dinners. If you join us for dinner you should be done by 6:00PM at the latest. If you are interested in joining this event please contact Philip Harvey at harvey1933@verizon.net or 610-357-9655 (e-mail strongly preferred). Hearing from you early would be very much appreciated. MLSC members have a history of responding "late in the game" but replying early increases our chances of getting an alternate private tour if desired. Directions to both Laurel Hill and "Fig" are furnished below.

Directions to Laurel Hill Cemetery: Proceed up the Benjamin Franklin Parkway (connects City Hall the Art Museum of Philadelphia) and pass to the right of the Art Museum. You will shortly see a gold statue of Joann of Arc on your right side. Hit your trip odometer at this point. Proceed 3.9 miles on the East River Drive (also called the Kelly Drive) and take a right turn on Midvale Avenue. There is a Sunoco station at this turn. In about thirty yards turn right on Ridge Avenue and proceed 0.5 miles until you see large white columns on your right. This marks the entrance to Laurel Hill Cemetery. You can park in the free lot across Ridge Avenue from the columns. Directions to Fig Restaurant:

Turn right out of the parking lot and proceed 0.5 miles. Turn left on Midvale Avenue. Turn left at the dead end on East River Drive (also called Kelly Drive) and proceed 3.9 miles to the Joan of Arc statue. Turn left so that the Joan of Arc statue will be only a few feet on your left. Proceed two blocks up 25Th. Street and Fig will be on the far left hand corner. Find a place to park and join the rest of our group at this fine BYOB restaurant.

Directions: Coming south on Rt. 252, take a left turn onto Rt. 3. At the third Light turn right into the entrance of Dunwoody Village (opposite street is Bryn Mawr Avenue). At the T intersection, turn Left. Follow road until you pass the Bank Barn on your right. Turn Right. Pass the Farmhouse (Dunwoody at Home Office) on your left and make a U-turn after the parking area. Address for Nailor's is #512. Park along the street.

Coming from Rt. 476, exit at #9 Broomall/ Newtown Square and head west on Rt. 3. Approximately 3 miles turn left at additional entrance to Dunwoody Village. Immediately turn left again. Follow directions to the Farmhouse and beyond.



"Field Trip" to Grounds for Sculpture in Hamilton, NJ

Sun., Oct. 15th 11:00 a.m.



Grounds For Sculpture is a 42-acre magnificently landscaped public sculpture park located in Hamilton, NJ. Since its inception, the park has built a collection of over 270 works of renowned

artists. It was founded in 1992 on the site of the former New Jersey Fairgrounds by J. Seward Johnson, a sculptor and philanthropist. His desire was to make contemporary sculpture as an art form more accessible and to offer people from all backgrounds the opportunity to become comfortable with contemporary art. Grounds For Sculpture was conceived as a place where audiences could experience sculpture in a familiar, accessible, and informal setting. The website is http://www.groundsforsculpture.org for more info.

Carpooling: We'll be meeting at the Barnes & Noble parking lot in Devon. Park away from the store and face the access road. As a public sculpture park, there is no cost. There are restaurants on the grounds, including the Rat's restaurant, a 2010 Diners' Choice Winner. Or, people can bring their own picnic lunch. Travel time is approximately 45 minutes from Barnes & Noble.

Directions to Grounds For Sculpture:

18 Fairgrounds RD, Hamilton, NJ 08619, telephone 609 586-0616. From Phila.: Take I 95 North, across the Scudders Falls Bridge (over the Delaware River) to I 295 South to exit 65B/Sloan Ave. West. After exit, stay in Right lane 2/10ths of a mile, following signs for Grounds For Sculpture, and take the jughandle to cross over Sloan Ave. Go thru the traffic light onto Klockner RD. Take Klockner RD to the next traffic light and turn Right onto East State St. Extension. Go 8/10ths of a mile and make 2nd Left onto Sculptors Way. Go 2/10ths of a mile and turn Left into the main entrance of Grounds For Sculpture.

Morris Arboretum of UPenn

Canopy Walk

The Morris Arboretum is the official arboretum of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Stroll through the classical English landscape structures and sculpture gardens at this 92-acre Victorian arboretum in the northwestern corner of Philadelphia. Watch for birds as you enjoy the elegant beauty of the 19th century grounds, complete with formal rose garden, majestic old trees and unusual plants from North America, Asia, Africa and Europe.

At the Out On A Limb Tree Adventure Exhibit, stop by the Canopy Walk: The centerpiece of a campus-wide exhibition at Morris Arboretum is a 450 foot-long, fully accessible tree canopy walk. It is one of few tree canopy walks in North America. Get a bird's eye view of the forest from 50 feet up, perched on a canopy walk high above ground level. Check out the Squirrel Scramble and the Bird's Nest.

Birding – Natural areas include Wetlands, meadows, and grasslands; a great habitat for birds. There are resident birds as well as migrating raptors and warblers to see. Check out their website to see pictures of all the species.

The Arboretum opens at 8:30 am to 5:00 pm. The average stay is about 3 hours, but you can stay as long as you want. Admission is \$15.00 for seniors; members are free. If we have 10 or more people, it's \$11 for seniors. I hope you can join us for a delightful day!

You then need to proceed through the light for the exit ramp for folks coming in the opposite direction.) At the next light, turn LEFT into Valley Forge Towers. The Clubhouse is on your RIGHT in a short distance. There is plenty of parking beyond the clubhouse on your left - you just may have to walk a little.
