Terra Cotta Warriors: Guardians of China’s First Emperor

At the National Geographic Museum

Come join us for this special exhibit comprised of soldiers, charioteers, archers, musicians, generals and acrobats. Nearly 2,000 years ago, thousands of life-size clay figures were buried in massive underground pits to accompany China’s first emperor, Qin Shihuangdi, into the afterlife. Their discovery outside the city of Xi’an in 1974 is one of the greatest archaeological finds of the 20th century.

Now you can stand face-to-face with these terra cotta warriors. SURCHARGES

There is a **surcharge for guests of members of \$35 per person** for major/airline trips and \$25 per person for weekend/bus trips.

When a trip has reached its quota, a formal waiting list will be established requiring a \$25 per person deposit for weekend/bus trips and \$35 per person for major/airline trips.
